### What happened in the Stone Age?

We will find out about the different time periods in the Stone Age and how they lived. We will begin to understand about their lives and where they lived and the animals that lived with them. We will continue to look at our prehistory and move into the Bronze Age to see how life for prehistoric man changed once metals became available.

**RE** - Looking what kind of world Jesus wanted and how and why people try to make the world a better place.

**Maths** - fractions; time; mass and capacity; properties of shapes.

**English** - writing stories, information texts and diary entries.

**Forest School** - team building, co-operation skills and developing skills when using a range of tools.

**Music** - Composing Stone Age music using hand-made instruments.

**History** - The Stone Age through to the Bronze Age looking at how and where they lived. What type of animals lived around the same time and how they evolved with the introduction of metal (bronze).

**PE and Games** - Tag Rugby and athletics. Please make sure your child has PE/Games kit (including trainers) in school on Mondays.

**PSHE** - Developing positive coping strategies and showing Heart values. Transition.



**Computing** - Internet safety; Using computer programming to create animations and animate Lego models.

**Science** - Plants - what they need to live and grow including the reproductive system.

**Art/DT** - making cave paintings and mixing colour palettes.

**Gardening** - developing skills using a range of tools to weed, plant and grow a variety of fruits and vegetables.

**French** - Months, days, animals and basic conversation.

**Homework** - Please make sure you sign your child's homework each week even if you haven't had time to complete any. Don't forget that spellings, times tables practise and reading to an adult are also part of each week's homework. Please ensure your child's reading books and reading record books come in to school each day. The children should use the reading record books for writing book reviews when they have finished a book and for when they have read to an adult.

Please come and ask if you have any questions. The end of the day is easier than the beginning!
